Neighborhood Impact Program \$2 million for low interest home improvement loans available now

Gate City Bank (GCB) and the City of Moorhead are working to keep Moorhead's mature neighborhoods strong and help homeowners reinvest in their homes with the Neighborhood Impact Program. Low interest loans are combined with City of Moorhead inspection services to assist homeowners with improvement projects on older homes. The program is available through September 1, 2017.

Eligible Improvement Costs

Funds may be used to address code and structural corrections, energy improvements, and general property improvements. Loans are available to finance new improvements not yet under construction, and if there are code corrections identified during the inspection, they must be addressed as part of the project.

Project must include at least one of the following:

- Foundation work (drain tile, bracing)
- Major exterior improvements (siding, roofing, windows)
- Addition of bedroom or new living space
- Major interior remodeling or replacement of major mechanical systems (furnace, electrical system)
- Convert rental unit to owner-occupied

How do I qualify?

Applications are reviewed on a first-come, firstserved basis as funds are available.



Loan Terms

- 2.25% fixed interest (2.26% APR*)
- Repayable over 10 years
- Min Ioan \$10,000/max \$75,000
- Max loan-to-value 90% (GCB guidelines)

Applicants

 Loan applicant must be the owneroccupant of the home and meet Gate City's credit standards for repayment of the improvement loan

Home/Property

- Built before 1990
- Located in City of Moorhead municipal boundaries
- Zoned for residential use
- Outside 100-year flood plain
- Assessed value under \$250,000
- Owner-occupied one or two unit residences (if there is a second unit, it must be a registered rental unit)
- Current on property taxes and special assessments

Minnesota Property Tax Refunds for Homeowners and Renters

Many Moorhead residents qualify | revenue.state.mn.us

Minnesota offers the following three property tax refund programs for homeowners and renters.

Homeowner's Homestead Credit Refund

You must have owned and lived in your home on January 2, 2017. The refund amount is based on household income, tax filing status, and property taxes paid on principal residence. The maximum refund is \$2,660.

Special Homeowner's Homestead Credit Refund

Based on the increase of your property tax over the previous year, regardless of income, homestead property owners may be eligible for a maximum refund of \$1,000. The following provisions must be met to qualify for the refund:

- Owned and lived in your home on both January 2, 2016, and January 2, 2017,
- Property taxes on your home increased by more than 12% and at least \$100 from 2016 to 2017, and
- Increases of the property taxes noted above cannot be the result of improvements you made to the property.

Renter's Property Tax Refund

Renters may also qualify for a Renter's Property Tax Refund. You will need your 2016 Certificate of Rent Paid. The maximum refund is \$2,060.

Filing instructions

Minnesota Department of Revenue provides information on how to file. You will need information from your 2017 Clay County property tax statement (mailed in March/April 2017) and your 2016 federal income tax return to fill out Form M1PR.

Timing

The filing deadline is August 15. Electronic submissions are free. Delinquent property taxes must be paid before you can apply for a refund. Missed last year's filing deadline? You have one year from the due date to file and claim a prior year refund.

Cleanup Week: May 1 – 5 Oakport Neighborhood Cleanup Day: May 9

Attention residents of single-family homes! Furniture, household goods, and appliances will be collected at your curb on your scheduled garbage day beginning at 5 am at no additional cost. Excess garbage set out before Cleanup Week will be collected for a fee. More information at **cleanupweek.com/moorhead.htm**. *Please note apartments and business are not eligible for the curbside Cleanup Week program, which is part of the residential rate structure*.

Cleanup Week guidelines

- Separate tires, appliances, furniture, brush, household garbage, metal, etc. into piles -separate trucks collect specific items
- Use disposable containers such as cardboard boxes
- Do not set items out more than one day early
- Crews will not return to pick up garbage set out after your garbage day
- Remove refrigerator and freezer doors for safety
- Do not place food or waste inside appliances
- No commercial waste will be accepted
- Keep your garbage tote at least 4 feet away from other Cleanup Week items

Specialty items collected at no additional charge

- Two appliances per household
- Tires (no rims)
- Empty propane tanks (valves do not need to be removed)

Get a jump on clean up!

- Bring furniture, household goods, and excess garbage to the Solid Waste Transfer Station April 24 – May 12 during normal Transfer Station hours, free of charge (also applies to apartments)
- Fees apply to demolition/construction materials
- Proof of Moorhead residency required (i.e. driver's license)



Where can I park? RV and off-street parking regulation updates

Some of the parking controls in residential neighborhoods changed recently. Here's a guide to the requirements:

| Vehicle Type | Residential Off-street Parking | Other Considerations |
|--|---|--|
| Passenger automobiles and other vehicles having registered gross vehicle weight less than 14,000 pounds and height less than 11 feet | Paved surface or in garage/ enclosed building | Must be currently licensed and in working condition. Can only be parked on grass while being washed. |
| Commercial vehicles and trailers having a registered gross vehicle weight exceeding 14,000 pounds or height over 11 feet | In enclosed building, otherwise not allowed in residential districts | |
| Recreational vehicles (motorized and non-motorized recreational vehicles that may provide living quarters) | Motor homes, converted buses or vans must be parked on paved surface; other recreational vehicles may be on unpaved surface if in RV side yard or RV Rear yard – see illustration below | Limit of 1 on a residential property; RVs in the RV front yard or RV side street yard must be 3 feet from the property line. If the vehicle is more than 11 feet in height and is parked in the RV front yard, it must be 8 feet from the side property line. |
| Recreational equipment (includes snowmobiles, personal watercraft, all-terrain vehicles, boats, utility trailers, horse trailers, and trailers used to transport recreational equipment) | | Limit of 2 recreational equipment items can be stored on a property at the same time (unless in an enclosed building). Exception: if an RV is located on the property, only one additional recreational equipment item may be stored on a property at the same time. If equipment is stored on a trailer, each vehicle or equipment is counted separately, but not the trailer. |
| Junk or inoperable vehicles | On a driveway or lot for up to 96 hours, otherwise in an enclosed building | May not be dismantled or repaired in a residential zone except in an enclosed building |




