Exterior

- Make house number visible from street
- __ Trim trees away from electrical wires
- __ Trim trees away from chimney and remove all pine needles and leaves from roofs, eaves & rain gutters For more information, contact MPS (218) 299-5400

- **Heating Equipment & Fireplace** __ Keep space heaters at least 3 feet away from all combustibles
- __ Replace furnace filters once a year
- __ Clean lint from behind clothes dryer
- __ Install a spark screen in front of the fireplace
- __ Have chimney inspected and cleaned annually
- __ Install a spark arrester on chimney
- __ Dispose of ashes in metal containers
- __ Keep newspapers, other combustibles and clutter away from water heater

Electrical

- __ Avoid overloading electrical circuits
- __ Inspect electrical cords and appliances for damage
- __ Do not tack cords to the wall or run them under rugs
- __ Maintain air space around electrical equipment, such as, TV, VCR, stereo, etc.
- _ Install additional outlets, by a qualified electrician, to avoid using cube taps and extension cords
- If you must use extension cords, use only the kind that have a built-in circuit breaker

Flammable Liquids & Hazardous Materials

- __ Limit the amount of chemicals stored
- __ Dispose of and recycle household hazardous materials properly (see below)
- Store hazardous materials in proper containers with
- tight- fitting lids and correct identification labels
- __ Store hazardous materials away from heat sources
- __ Allow for proper ventilation when using flammable liquids and hazardous materials
- _ Put oily rags in metal containers with tight-fitting lids, not in a pile where they can spontaneously ignite

Cooking

- __ Never leave cooking unattended
- __ Cuff sleeves and turn pot handles
- inward when cooking to avoid bum injuries
- never store combustibles in oven or on top of stove
- When barbequing, move unit away from the house
- ___ Dispose of coals /ashes in metal containers

Smoking Materials & Candles

- __ Never leave cigarettes or candles unattended
- Purchase and use ashtrays that have the center support feature
- Empty ashtrays into noncombustible containers only
- Never smoke in bed
- Place candles in noncombustible, sturdy holders
- __ Keep matches and Lighters out of reach of children

Smoke Alarms/Carbon Monoxide Alarms (CO)

- __ Install smoke alarms inside and outside
- every sleeping area and on every level of your home
- Test smoke alarms once a month
- Tip: use a broom handle to reach & push test button
- Replace smoke alarm batteries once a year Tip: use Daylight Savings Time as a reminder
- Replace smoke alarm units every 10 years
- __ Install CO alarms near sleeping rooms

Fire Extinguishers

- __ Purchase a multipurpose (ABC) extinguisher
- __ Teach your family how to use a fire extinguisher
- (Use P.A.S.S.: Pull the pin, Aim, Squeeze, Sweep)
- Inspect extinguishers annually

Develop & Practice A Home Escape Plan

- _ Develop a home escape plan that includes:
 - Crawling low under smoke
 - Two exits out of every room
 - A meeting place outside (tree, mailbox, etc.)
- Practice escape plan with every member
- Teach all family members how to:
 - Dial 9 -1 -1 in an emergency
 - (State your name, location & type of emergency)
 - Stop, drop, and roll if clothes catch fire
