

# SE MAIN – OTVR QUIET ZONE

## STUDY DETAILS

The City of Moorhead is proposing a quiet zone, to eliminate most train-horn noise. The proposed zone affects six crossings along the Otter Tail Valley Railroad railway, which follows Southeast Main Avenue. This stretches from Oak Way to 40th Avenue. This quiet zone would be independent of the existing quiet zones in downtown Moorhead that extend from the Fargo-Moorhead border to 14th Street.

The quiet zone will provide a tremendous benefit to the travelling public and residents along the rail corridor in terms of both noise reduction and safety. The table to the right quantifies these benefits and the figures included illustrate the planned improvements.


The project is tentatively programmed in the City's five-year capital improvement plan for construction in 2018. However, the City is moving forward with a number of projects and studies to keep the project moving toward the 2018 completion date.

The construction year is dependent upon the type of funding pursued. Using a combination of special assessments and City cost-share will enable the project to be completed by 2018, barring any unforeseen setbacks. Federal funding is not expected to be available by 2018. Full or partial state aid may be available in the future, but is likely to delay the project.
