PAPER

Newspapers, shoppers, and anything that is delivered in the newspaper, including glossy inserts, magazines, small catalogs, and similar printed material with glossy pages.





Egg cartons, phone books, and office paper.

PLASTIC

-  All bottles and jugs.
-  All bottles, jugs, tubs, lids, and containers up to 5 gallon buckets.
-  All bottles, containers, and lids (no film or bags).
-  All bottles, containers, and lids (no film or bags).
-  Bottles only accepted.



 &  plastics, bags, microwave trays, VCR tapes, toys, electronics, meat packaging containers, film, vinyl, bread bags, grocery bags, Styrofoam cups, and fast food containers.

CARDBOARD

Flattened Corrugated 3" x 3" size cardboard boxes, brown (kraft) bags, beverage containers (unwaxed), shoe boxes, cereal and food boxes, and paper board.



Waxed board or white boxes that come from the refrigerator or the freezer section.

GLASS

Clear, brown, and green glass bottles and jars.



Ceramics, Pyrex, window glass, and light bulbs.

METAL

Aluminum, steel, and tin cans



Scrap metal (car parts, iron, and steel), razor blades, tin foil, rusty cans, nails, and aerosol cans.

4. Refer to this calendar and the current week to determine which cycle is active.

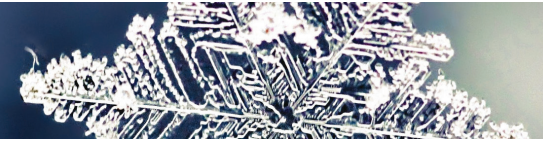

NEW SNOW REMOVAL DISTRICT

The snow removal district boundaries and regulations have been changed for simplicity and convenience. Below is a sample from the new Snow Removal District brochure. Please check out www.cityofmoorhead.com/snowdistrict for full program details and snow district boundaries.

OVERVIEW

A Snow Removal District is a designated area with special parking regulations in effect during a Snow Removal Declaration, allowing crews to better plow roads and for emergency vehicles to travel safely in areas where there is normally a lot of on-street parking. All Snow District roadways are posted with signs.

Routine snow removal will occur throughout the City after a snowfall. Within the Snow Removal District, after a heavy snowfall, crews will come back to clear the roads curb-to-curb on regular road maintenance days when cars are not present.

TOW ZONE

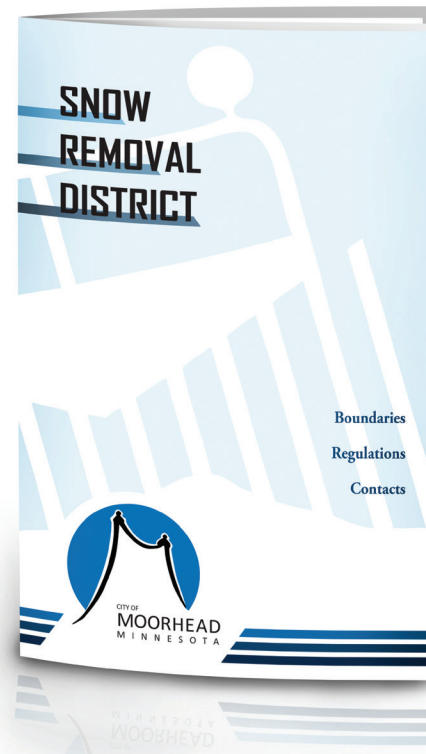
If you park in a no-parking zone during a snow removal declaration, your car will be towed instead of ticketed as it would be on a regular road no-parking maintenance schedule.

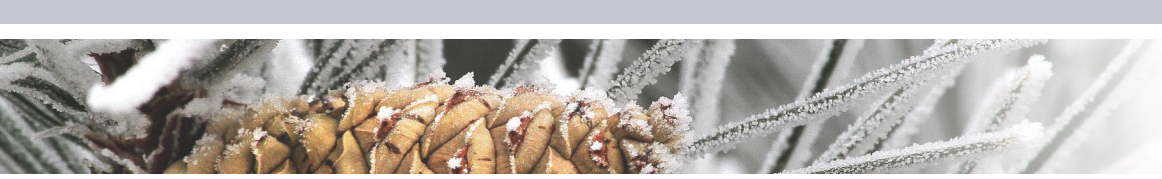

curbside collections

GARBAGE | 218.299.5347

Monday - Friday | 8:00 a.m. to 4:15 p.m.

- Curbside collection begins at 5 a.m., so place carts out the evening before. A \$15 fee applies to return and dump carts that aren't out on time.
- Trash must be in automated garbage cart or pre-paid yellow bag. Extra garbage not in pre-paid yellow bags carries a \$15 minimum collection charge. Larger items can be collected for an extra charge; call **218.299.5465**.
- Leave two feet of clearance around cart for ease of collection.
- Don't place the cart on the street. It must be behind the curb, on the boulevard or driveway, and within 4 feet of the street year-round.
- Batteries of all types may be disposed of free of charge at the Transfer Station.



RECYCLING | 218.299.5347

Monday - Friday | 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

- Pick-up begins at 5 a.m. every other week on your garbage day; check the City Calendar for your week (A or B).
- Residents must buy a blue recycling container for \$5 so recycling materials can be identified.
- All materials must be clean; labels may remain on. Separate metal cans, newspaper, magazines, corrugated cardboard/boxboard (cereal boxes), plastics #1, #2, #4, #5, #7 (not #3 & #6), glass bottles and jars (any color).

CLEAN-UP WEEK MAY 5 - 9

- Please separate trash, appliances and tires; no more than 2 appliances per household.
- Do not throw computer monitors, television sets, lumber, concrete, building materials, batteries, paint, hazardous chemicals, oil or anti-freeze; call **218.299.5347** to discuss disposal. There will be a disposal fee for items listed above.
- Trash placed at the curb BEFORE the start of Clean-Up Week will be collected and billed as a special pick-up at a \$15 minimum charge.

COMPOST SITE | 218.979.9516

Monday - Friday | 8:00 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. & Saturday 8:00 a.m. - 11:45 a.m.

- Curbside yard waste pick up is weather permitting and runs from April 15 - December 1 on your regular garbage day.
- 24-hour yard waste dump sites (no branches) are at the same locations as drop sites listed above for recyclables.
- Yard waste with acceptable materials (small twigs that are no larger than a pencil, leaves, grass and organic materials from gardens) must be in clear 32-gallon bags or 32-gallon cans that weigh less than 30 pounds.
- Moorhead and Clay County residents may receive two yards per day of free compost.

BRANCH PICK-UP | 218.299.5422

Monday - Friday 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on regular garbage day, Spring to Fall; pick up is available the rest of the year on a call-in basis. Call for more information.

- Place branches directly on the ground, not in containers.
- Branches cut by a tree contractor or landscape company need to be removed and disposed of by that company. Curbside collection is for homeowner cut branches.
- Cut only logs less than 8" in diameter so that one person can lift into a branch chipper.
- One pile per week that is no larger than 4' high by 8' wide by 12' long will be picked up at no charge.
- Larger piles cut by homeowners are collected for a fee of \$120 per hour with a \$60 minimum.
- Root balls are collected for a charge of \$20 per cubic yard.
- All elm material removed at no charge if separated.
- Bring materials to the Compost Site during business hours.

All collections will be made on your regular garbage day. If garbage isn't collected due to holidays, it will be collected the next business day.

MPD IN THE SCHOOLS

The subject of school safety is of concern for families, school administrators, and the entire community. The Moorhead Police Department (MPD) has a long history of partnering with the Moorhead Area Public Schools to ensure safety and security. MPD has two School Resources Officers (SROs) who work as liaisons between the Police Department and the School District. Brian Dahl is the SRO assigned to the Moorhead High School and SRO Jeff Nelson is assigned to Horizon Middle School. The SROs work with all the schools in coordinating and facilitating emergency drills and crisis planning, including a full-scale evacuation drill of Horizon Middle School conducted in 2013.

D.A.R.E.

MPD has a full-time D.A.R.E. officer, Valerie Kellen, who teaches the nationally acclaimed substance abuse prevention education curriculum to all the elementary schools. Officer Kellen also teaches a "next level of learning" D.A.R.E. program in the 7th grade at Horizon Middle School. D.A.R.E. is taught in Moorhead's private schools as well.

MPD's Youth Services Coordinator, Louis Ochoa, works out of the Red River Area Learning Center, Moorhead Area Public School's alternative learning facility. Ochoa serves as a mentor while working with youth who have behavioral issues or truancy problems. Ochoa also supervises the juvenile community service program which focuses on graffiti removal and clean-up projects throughout the City.

"Through our SRO Program, students have a mentor and a community representative to act as a role model, educator, and guide. Our SRO Program aligns with our district priority of having a safe, healthy, and respectful learning environment for all learners."

PROGRAMS

MPD works to implement new and innovative ways to collaborate with youth and promote positive decision-making skills. In 2010, MPD first introduced "Every 15 Minutes"—a powerful program to prevent underage drinking and driving. In 2013, MPD and the Moorhead High School teamed up again to put on the two-day program that provides a glimpse into the impact one poor decision can have on friends, family, and the community as a whole. MPD implemented Text-A-Tip in all schools as an easy and anonymous way for students to share information with our SROs.

DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW

The City employs 33 full-time, licensed professional firefighters who provide 24-hour emergency services every day. Four administrative personnel support operations and manage a variety of public safety programs.

In addition to fighting fires, the Fire Department:

- responds to medical emergencies
- provides technical, water, and ice rescue services
- provides fire safety training
- inspects commercial businesses and rental housing units
- manages City-wide risks from natural and man-made emergencies
- investigates all fires in the City

We provide responses to hazardous material accidents, large and small, for most of Northwest Minnesota. We also pool resources with other departments and agencies across Minnesota and in our Metro area during larger incidents.

CALLING ALL HEROES!

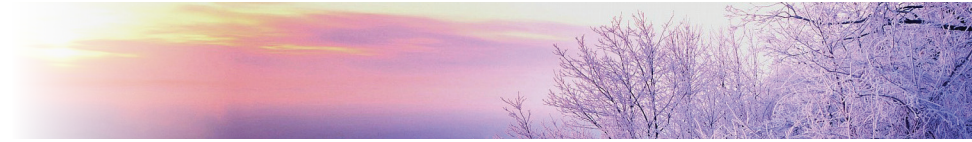

Areas of responsibility include mowing of highway ditches, medians, and City-owned lots. Along with mowing, we also include spraying of herbicides and litter control in the same areas.

WHAT ARE THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF RIGHT-OF-WAY MAINTENANCE DURING WINTER MONTHS?

During the winter months, Right-of-Way Maintenance removes snow from sidewalks that are adjacent to City-owned property, double frontage lots, bus shelters, and certain bike/pedestrian pathways.

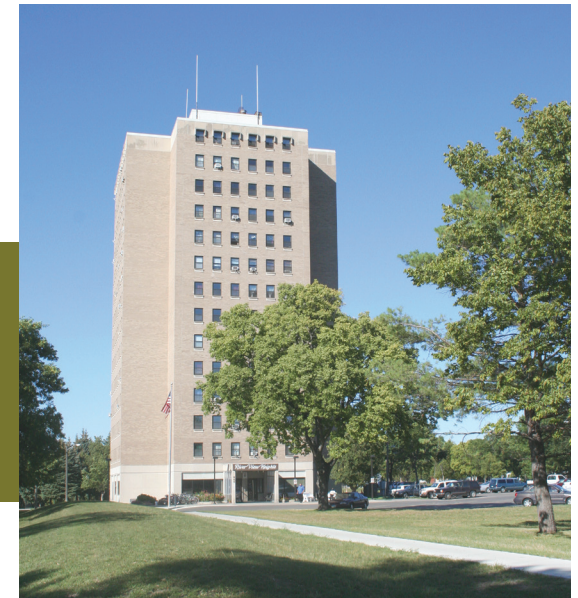

removal of snow and ice

FROM SIDEWALKS

Duty of Occupant

The occupant and/or owner of every building and unoccupied lot on any street or avenue, must clear the sidewalk of snow and ice in front of the building or lot by 9:00 p.m. of each day, and keep it clean of snow and ice.

City Removal

In all cases where snow and ice are not removed by 9:00 p.m., it may be removed by authorized city personnel. The owner/occupant of the property will be charged the cost of removal, along with an administrative fee set by the City Council.



DEPOSITING SNOW ON STREETS

Any person who moves, blows, or plows snow is prohibited from depositing the snow on any City street. This goes for occupants, owners, agents, independent contractors, or employees of buildings. Arrangements should be made to deposit snow in some place other than on the street and not piled in ways that would interfere with the vision of motorists at intersections.

PENALTY

Any person convicted of violating any rules of this section shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor and be subject to a fine no more than \$200, or an administrative penalty.
