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
### Moorhead Fire Department Mission Statement







Retired Chief Marty Soeth passed away this year and was honored by emergency service organizations from around the region for his many contributions over the years.



- Reorganization within the City. The Building Codes Divisioin moved out of the Fire Department Annex on January 29, 2005, and relocated to City Hall as part of the reorganization plan. The Building Codes Division was moved under the direction of the Community Development Department prior to their move to City Hall.
- The reorganization plan also included the Neighborhood Services Division being housed at the Fire Department Annex and being in charge of the Rental Housing Program and Environmental Health. The Neighborhood Services Division would also fall under the direction of the Community Development Department, but would be located at the Fire Department Annex.
