

Site Plan Details

Your Site Plan must include:

- property boundaries
- existing structure(s)
 - o house
 - garage/shed
- proposed structure(s)
 - o pool
 - pool equipment (filter unit, pump, heater)
 - o fence or wall
- existing and proposed impervious surface*
 - driveway
 - o walkway
 - o patio
- setbacks to property lines
- easements
- utility locations
- *An impervious surface is any surface that cannot effectively absorb or infiltrate rainfall. (Pools unable to maintain a minimum of 6 inches of depth between top of pool edge and top of water surface are impervious surface.)



** If the site plan is not drawn to scale, please note the square footage of all structures and impervious surfaces.

**All Pools shall comply with Moorhead City Code Chapter 9 - Pools and Minnesota State Building Code.

- Pool location shall be at least 5 feet from property lines in the side or rear yard.
- Permit required for all in-ground pools and above-ground pools that meet or exceed both 5,000 gallons and 24-inch depth.
 - Must be completely enclosed by a fence or wall measuring at least 5 feet in height. Any
 openings between bottom of fence or wall and ground shall not exceed 4 inches. No fence or
 wall required, if one of the following methods is used when pool is not in use:
 - Using a walkable, hard surface cover for an in-ground pool
 - Remove detachable ladder or retract retractable ladder for above-ground pool
