### **FAQ**

#### Where can the garden be located?

Any privately owned land in the City of Moorhead. If you are not the property owner or spokesperson you must provide a letter of approval from property owner.

#### How can funds be spent?

Funds can be used to support the community garden. Potential uses include seeds, raised beds, weed control, soil preparation, etc. Personnel costs, water bills, structures are not eligible.

# Can I start a community garden for my apartment complex?

Yes! You will need to provide written permission with the application.

## Are there restrictions where the garden can be located?

Generally no, however there are some considerations:

Avoid easement areas. If work needs to be done in an easement the garden may be damaged/removed and would need to be replaced at your cost.

  - Select layers list
  - Expand Cadastral
  - Check Easements

Plants cannot exceed 2 ft when within 5 ft of a driveway or alley or within 30 ft of an intersection.

Garden cannot be planted on or within 20 ft of flood protection infrastructure unless approved by the City Engineer.

Gardens cannot be planted within boulevards or right-of-way without a permit from the Engineering Department.
