Resolution to Enter into a Lease Agreement / Professional Services Agreement with Historical and Cultural Society of Clay County

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to consider a resolution to enter into a Lease / Professional Services Agreement with Historical and Cultural Society of Clay County (HCSCC) to lease space and interpret the City owned artifacts at the Hjemkomst Center (Center).

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The City has entered into a Professional Services Agreement with Red River Valley Center at Moorhead / Historical and Cultural Society of Clay County (HCSCC) since 1990 when the City obtained ownership of the Center. The current Professional Services Agreement with HCSCC expires March 31, 2024

Details of the Agreement for HCSCC include;

- Total exclusive square footage with this agreement would be approximately 20,100 square feet and shared use space of 8,600 square feet (final areas are defined in the lease).
- HCSCC will continue to interpret and give tours for the City owned Hjemkomst Ship and Stave Church and will retain the ability to charge an admission fee to help finance their operation.
- Term of the agreement is April 1, 2024 December 31, 2026

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Terms of this agreement include payment of \$11,475 as a base fee in 2024 with an annual increase of 3%.

WHEREAS, the City would like to enter into a Lease/Professional Services Agreement with Red River Valley Center at Moorhead / Historical and Cultural Society of Clay County (HCSCC) to lease space and provide interpretive services for the City owned artifacts at the Hjemkomst Center; and

WHEREAS, the City has had similar agreements with HCSCC since taking over ownership of the Hjemkomst Center in 1990 and desires to continue this relationship for HCSCC to provide activities, exhibits and programs at the Center that will enhance the mission; and

WHEREAS, HCSCC will contribute a base lease rate of \$11,475 starting in 2024 with a 3% annual increase to the Hjemkomst Center – Repair and Replacement Fund during the terms of the lease; and

WHEREAS, the term of the Lease will extend to December 31, 2026.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Moorhead, that the City Council does hereby authorize and direct the Mayor and City Manager to enter into a Lease Agreement/Professional Services Agreement with Historical and Cultural Society of Clay County to lease space and provide services as approved by the City Attorney.

Second Reading of Ordinance 2024-02: An Ordinance to Amend and Reenact Title 10, Chapter 18, Section 1, Use Regulations, and Title 10, Chapter 18, Section 2, Provisional and Conditional Use Requirements relating to the New Cannabis Law and Repeal Title 4, Chapter 4, Section 21, Offenses related to Drug Paraphernalia

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to consider a second reading of Ordinance 2024-02: An Ordinance to Amend and Reenact Title 10, Chapter 18, Section 1, Use Regulations, and Title 10, Chapter 18, Section 2, Provisional and Conditional Use Requirements relating to the New Cannabis Law and Repeal Title 4, Chapter 4, Section 21, Offenses related to Drug Paraphernalia and a Resolution to Approve Title & Summary of Ordinance 2024-02.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

On May 30, 2023, Governor Walz signed new legislation into law legalizing adult-use recreational cannabis, which also incorporates and clarifies previously approved medical cannabis and cannabinoid laws. This new law has multiple dates for consideration:

July 1, 2023 - legalized adult possession and home cultivation of cannabis

- August 1, 2023 lifted criminal penalties for adult possession and home cultivation of cannabis, and legalized drug paraphernalia statewide
- 2025 state licensing for cannabis-related businesses will begin once Office of Cannabis Management formulates requirements and processes

New rules for previously approved medical cannabis and cannabinoid state licensing:

- New law will transfer medical cannabis licensing to MN Office of Cannabis Management.
- New law will also transfer edible cannabinoids licensing to MN Office of Cannabis Management and City will no longer issue local licenses.

The new law, <u>Chapter 342, Cannabis</u>, permits cities to regulate cannabis-related businesses by the following options:

- 1. If the State issues a license, cities cannot prohibit the operation as zoning verification will be part of the State licensing procedure.
- 2. Cities may then require City-registration of licensed businesses for compliance purposes.
- 3. Cities may adopt reasonable restrictions on the time, place and manner of operation.
- a. If they so choose, cities may only prohibit operation within 1,000 feet of a school or within 500 feet of a daycare, residential treatment facility or an attraction within a public park that is regularly used by minors, including a playground or athletic field.
- b. Cities may also limit cannabis retailer operations to no fewer than one registration for every 12,500 residents but does not prohibit cities from allowing licensed retailers in excess of minimums.

The City Manager assembled a cannabis work group to study the new law comprised of staff from Moorhead Police, City Attorney's Office, City Prosecutor, City Clerk's Office, City Manager's Office and the Community Development Department. One of the immediate items that needs to be addressed is updating the Zoning Use Table in order for prospective businesses to know where they can and cannot locate within the city. The work group is not recommending any license limits or buffers at this time but will monitor license-holders. If issues arise, amendments to the code can be considered.

The Planning Commission reviewed proposed use table additions at their December 4, 2023 meeting and unanimously recommend approval of the proposed zoning changes with no public comment. The complete Planning Commission packet is available at: City of Moorhead: Planning Commission

Since the Planning Commission, the work group added provisions to clarify home/personal and medical cannabis uses. Also, staff has consulted with the only medical dispensary in Moorhead and made proposed changes related to their business.

Lastly, the new law made drug paraphernalia legal statewide therefore the work group is recommending the total repeal of Title 4, Chapter 4, Section 21, Offenses related to Drug Paraphernalia.

The City Council approved a first reading of the Ordinance on February 12, 2024.

Since the first reading, two small changes were made to the draft ordinance text:

- 1. EE. State Licensed Medical Cannabis Combination Businesses was renamed to <u>FF. State Licensed Medical Cannabis Combination Businesses</u>, and
- 2. <u>1.d. manufacture adult-use cannabis edibles</u> was added to <u>FF. State Licensed Medical Cannabis Combination Businesses</u>





RECOMMENDATION:

The Moorhead Public Service Commission respectfully requests the Mayor and City Council award the bids for 2024 Water Distribution Pipe and Fittings to the lowest, qualified bidder meeting the specifications, as shown on the attached Bid Tabulation Sheet.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

Moorhead Public Service (MPS) is projected to replace approximately 9,000 feet (1.70 miles) of cast iron (CI) watermain in 2024. MPS' water distribution crew will be completing three projects (55 percent of the footage), and the two remaining projects (45 percent of the footage) will be contracted out. MPS' self-performed watermain replacement projects coincide with the City of Moorhead's street improvement projects. A significant amount of water distribution pipe and fittings will be required in order to complete maintenance and repair projects on watermain, services, hydrants, and valves throughout the 2024 construction season.

Bids were opened on February 7, 2024, and MPS received one qualified bid from Ferguson Waterworks, and two unqualified bids due to the bidders not including bid security with their bids.

MPS recommends awarding Bid Item #1, Water Distribution Repair Sleeves, to Ferguson Waterworks in the amount of \$12,830.88, and awarding Bid Item #2, Miscellaneous Water Distribution Materials, to Ferguson Waterworks in the amount of \$252,218.22. Staff's estimated cost for Bid Item #1 was \$9,000.00 and Bid Item #2 was \$269,000.00.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Although there is no cost to the City of Moorhead (directly), the total cost to the Moorhead Public Service Commission for the 2024 Water Distribution Pipe and Fittings is \$265,049.10.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Moorhead Public Service Commission respectfully requests the Mayor and City Council award the bid for 2024 Access Improvements for Moorhead Public Service's Lime Sludge Dewatering Facility to the lowest, qualified bidder meeting the specifications, as shown on the attached Bid Tabulation Sheet.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The purpose of this project is to improve access to Moorhead Public Service's (MPS') newly-constructed Lime Sludge Dewatering Facility by constructing a concrete driveway better suited to handle heavy equipment use. This project will also include constructing proper drainage for the surrounding area adjacent to the Lime Sludge Dewatering Facility. The current roadway material is a combination of aggregate and recycled pavement. These materials are subject to shifting and settling throughout the annual weather seasons resulting in ponding water and frost heaves. The concrete driveway will also reduce tracking material onto Minnesota Highway 75 North and eliminate rutting near the newly-installed security gate. On a weekly basis, the current access driveway is heavily trafficked with over a dozen semi-trucks entering and exiting to haul the newly-produced lime sludge material.

The Access Improvements for the Lime Sludge Dewatering Facility project was first advertised for bids in June 2023. On June 28, 2023, MPS received two qualified bids in the amounts of \$546,450.50 and \$646,248.00. In comparison, this was a 15 percent price increase over the engineer's estimate of \$466,193.00. Due to the lack of bids received and bids well exceeding the engineer's estimate, it was recommended by staff, and approved by the Commission on July 18, 2023, to reject all bids and rebid the project in January 2024.

The purpose of rebidding the project in January 2024 was to bid the project in a more favorable bidding climate by receiving additional, qualified bids and competitive pricing. The project was advertised for bids in January 2024. On February 7, 2024, MPS received four qualified bids. As shown on the attached Bid Tabulation, bids were received from four local contractors ranging in the amounts from \$448,721.50 to \$538,000.00. As shown in the attached recommendation letter from Apex Engineering Group, the low bid from Hough, Inc., is \$97,729.00 less than the original low bid that MPS received in 2023—with no changes made to the project's scope.

MPS staff recommends awarding the base bid and the additive alternate to Hough, Inc., of Detroit Lakes, Minnesota, in the amount of \$448,721.50. Hough, Inc., has successfully completed work for MPS in the past and has demonstrated that they have the ability to complete this project as specified.



Used Car Dealership Permit Denial Appeal - Amedy Auto

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to consider a denial for the 2024 renewal of Amedy Auto's Used Car Dealer License.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

Amedy Auto owner Nashwan Amedy was contacted by the City Clerk's office on February 16, 2024 due to not receiving renewal paperwork for the 2024 license period. At the February 13, 2023 City Council meeting, the decision to deny the 2023 license was tabled until additional information from the County was obtained.

A background was completed on February 16, 2024. Upon receiving the completed background check, the City Clerk's office forwarded the findings to Attorney John Shockley to review, who agreed with the decision to deny the license based upon Moorhead City Code 2-1-10(2), which allows for denial based on a conviction.

The misdemeanor conviction is directly related to the business which supports the decision to deny the permit. City Clerk, Christina Rust sent an email explaining the reasons for denial along with information on how to appeal the decision and followed up by sending a certified letter to the owner.

On February 21, 2024 a formal request to appeal the decision was received from Mr. Amedy via email.

If the City Council votes to uphold the decision to deny the permit, City Attorney Shockley will produce Findings of Fact for the Council to review and approval at the meeting on March 11, 2024.
